

Eighth Annual Reunion

On Sunday, September 4, 1949, at their eighth annual reunion held at the Rifle Association Hall in Round Top, Texas, the Von Rosenberg Family observed their 100th Anniversary of the arrival in America of Peter Karl Johann von Rosenberg and his family. 171 registered.

After the reunion prayer was read by Dr. Wm. Wingo and the picnic luncheons had been eaten, the meeting was called to order by the President, Ernest von Rosenberg of Austin. Miss Olga Scholz and Mrs. Fred Rentsch, accompanied at the piano by Mr. Alfred Wupperman, led the group in singing the songs "Forefathers" and "America."

The minutes of the seventh annual reunion read by the secretary, Mrs. Carlina Thompson, were accepted. The Treasurer, Mrs. Mary Zoll, reported a balance of \$59.95 in the treasury, and her report was accepted.

The chairman of the Pioneer Grandmother Monument Fund, Herman von Rosenberg, stated that a monument had been

Grandmother Amanda's grave at a total
cost of \$280⁰⁰. He stated that the \$148³⁴
previously collected had been turned over
to Mrs. C. D. Krause for payment to the
Holy Memorials in La Grange, and that a
balance of \$131⁶⁶ remained.

Charles van Rosenberg made a brief
talk thanking the persons who had worked
on the newly published family history
book, namely, Martha Meerscheidt, Alma
Domlison, the Branch chairmen, and Laura
Wingo. He concluded his talk by stating
"The book which has come out is a credit
to all the above and to the memory of
Martha Meerscheidt."

Motion made, seconded, and carried
that Mrs. Alma Domlison be given an
autographed gift copy of the family history.
The book, which was autographed by those
present, was presented to Mrs. Domlison
by Mrs. Clark van Rosenberg.

Mrs. Laura Wingo made a financial
report on the family history book, which
is being sold for \$5⁰⁰ a copy. She stated
that the Branch chairmen had advanced

enough money to pay the printer,
so that the Ass'n was a little in debt
to the branch chairmen. Motion made,
seconded, and carried that the consol
books be turned over to Mrs. Tomlinson
for later sales. Mrs. Wingo asked that errors
in the book be called to her attention so
that a mimeographed correction sheet
could be distributed.

made, seconded, and carried that the
association meet in San Antonio next
year, and motion made, seconded, and
carried that the meeting be held the first
Sunday in May.

A collection for the Monument Fund was taken and then the President turned the meeting over to the President-Elect, Clark von Rosenberg.

Motion made, seconded, and carried that the Monument Committee through the Assin's Secretary send to all those not present at this meeting a letter asking for additional contributions to the monument.

The San Antonio membership is to compose the arrangement committee for the next reunion. A discussion was held for and against furnishing

barbecue and/or the entire meal at the reunions. Motion made and seconded that the present eating arrangement be continued, that is, the members bringing picnic lunches. A vote was taken, and the motion carried.

A motion was made and seconded to adjourn the eighth annual reunion.
