MINUTES OF VON ROSENBERG FAMILY ORGANIZATION OF TEXAS MAY 8, 1955

At this Reunion meeting held at American Legion Park near Round Top, Texas, there were registered 52 paid attendants, and 36 non-paying attendants, making a total of 88.

President Hilmer C. von Rosenberg called the meeting to order at 1:30 P. M., and stated the main purpose of this annual Reunion was to elect officers and directors (2) to fill expiring terms.

Alfred Wupperman, Chairman of the Nominating Committee, reported he was unable to find members who would agree to take office. Nomination were thereupon called for from the floor. Mr. Hein nominated Mr. Alfred Wuppermann for President. Seconded and carried unanimously after the nomination was seconded and heartily endorsed by the retiring President.

Mr. Morris Granville was then nominated by Mrs. Paula Hein for the office of Vice-President. Seconded and passed unanimously.

For the office of Secretary Mr. George von Carlowitz was nominated and on motion duly passed he was elected.

Mrs. Paula Hein then nominated Clark von Rosenberg for Treasurer. Seconded and carried unanimously.

Discussion as to election of two Directors to represent the two family branches not now having a place on the Executive Committee led to a motion by Mr. Scholz that the new President, Mr. Wuppermann, be authorized to select two members as acting Directors till an election can be had at a later meeting. This was seconded and carried.

Treasurer Henry Hein made a verbal report showing the following condition: Balance from last year \$131.95; collections at this meeting \$52; expenses of the 1954 Reunion were \$54.93; expenses for this year \$38.25 for stationery, postage, etc., rent of hall \$2, care of cemetary lot \$4, leaving a balance of \$84.77 in the treasury.
