

MINUTES OF 21st ANNUAL von ROSENBERG REUNION,
at Round Top, Texas, May 6, 1962

After reunion prayer and lunch we opened business with Pres. Robert Hein presiding. Mr. Fred Reutzel thanked Mrs. Daisy Fricke for arranging for our use the nice Veterans of Foreign Wars hall. We sang our reunion song, then America.

After discussion of address list problems we approved making Mr. Hilmer von Rosenberg permanent address list headquarters: 320 N. Dewey, San Antonio, Texas.* We approved printing 100 copies of the address list. Each member present stood up and introduced himself.
