the 40th such Reunion, the 42nd year of the Association, the 115th year after Peter Carl's death, and the 1st year the Reunion has ever been held in the beautiful city of Galveston, Texas.

## WHO WILL FORGET?

According to our booklet "Emigration of the von Rosenbergs to Texas, 1849," after eight weeks and 3 days aboard the ship FRANZISKA our Pioneer Family arrived at Galveston, Tx. on Dec. 5, 1849. They were in quest of a new beginning for themselves, a life void of wars, strife and political upheaval. Galveston was very important to them because it marked the end of a long and wearisome ocean voyage.

One hundred thirty-one and a half years later, it's interesting to note, a band of their descendants will approach that same city of Galveston, not from the East on a sailing ship but from the West in high powered automobiles eager and longing to pay honor to the landing of that Pioneer Family.

# THE FAMILY RETURNS

We, too, are still looking for the good life void of wars, strife and political trickery, except we get to add rampant crime, decaying morals and runaway inflation to their list.

# THE SHRINE THOUGH

If you should ask the natives of Galveston the best facility they have to hold a large meeting in, they'd all answer: "The Shrine Temple." We have secured this fine Temple for our Reunion this your at a very moderate cost.

# DIFECTIONS TO A REUNION

First, find yourself in the city of Houston. Houston is circled by Loop 610. No matter where you come from you're gonna' hit 510. Take 610 EAST until you come to I-45 (& 75) SOUTH (Galveston.) It's unnecessary to get off 610 in Houston unless you just want to.

Go I-45 south for a little less than an hour and you'll come over a big bridge which leads into Galveston. Without turning, I-45 becomes Broadway in Galveston. Whenever you want, take a right off Broadway and come straight to Seawall Blvd. (no further, please, there's the water). Take a right on Seawall Blvd., go to the 5500 block and find El Mina Shrine Temple on your right (on your left is the water, again).
