the 42nd such Reunion, the 44th year of the Association, the 117th year after Peter Carl's death and the 1st year the Reunion has ever been held in the friendly city of La Grange, Texas.

CONSIDER

For years now, many members have requested that the Reunion be held in an outside setting, away from the congestion of big cities like Austin, San Antonio, Galveston, or San Marcos. The two Reunions at Rockport, the Rosenberg and the Round Tops were definitely secluded but not quite like this one will be.

The Site-Selection Committee, appointed by President Russell Campbell at the '82 Reunion has come up with a dandy. The Committee, consisting of Glenn von Rosenberg of Waco, Gary & Darlyn Bechtol of Austin, William, Jr. and William III von Rosenberg of Austin, visited several sites and drove many miles searching for just the "right spot." And indeed, they found it: They found Camp Lone Star at La Grange, Texas, a city very familiar to our Association members because several Social Evenings have been held in La Grange prior to the Round Top Reunions.

WHAT IS CAMP LONE STAR?

Beautiful and modern! Ideal for us! It offers all the normal outdoor activities like hiking, a lake, canoeing, horseback riding, swimming pool, horseshoes, badminton, volleyball, basketball, paddle tennis, loafing, idling, talking, whittling, beer-drinking, peace, quietness, and whatever. Definitely a contact with the Lord's creation!

But it also has it's indoor attractions. what they call the "RETREAT CENTER" you have the most modern facilities you'll ever see. The huge building is practically brand new; it opened in July of 1980. Here's what it has: air-conditioning, phones, very good meals served buffet-style (all you can eat), very nice rooms, hot tub and exercise room, soda & candy machines, coffee and drink bar, game room, TV, cards and dominos, fireplace, beauty, decorations, carpets, excellent parking, and tremendous meeting rooms. I, myself, went to inspect it and I agree with the Selection Committee. It's "just right" for our Reunion and I know you will agree when you see it. You'll have great activities outside and 1st class comfort inside. WOW!

DIRECTIONS TO CAMP LONE STAR

Immediately south of La Grange on Highway #77 south (to Victoria), is the bridge spanning the Colorado river. About 150 YARDS from the southern end of the bridge is a sign "CAMP LONE STAR." Turn into that road (east) and go 2 miles to the Camp following the signs. One-half mile is paved, the other $1\frac{1}{2}$ is dirt but in good condition. Park, register in the RETREAT CENTER, unload your car and get set for a relaxing time.

HOW IT WORKS!

This Reunion is scheduled for $2\frac{1}{2}$ days--Fri., Sat. and Sunday, July 15, 16 & 17. You can come anytime you wish, whatever your "thing" is, but DO arrive by Sun. morning at 10:00. Many will take advantage and be there all $2\frac{1}{2}$ days because it's going to be fun and enjoyable. It will amount to a short $2\frac{1}{2}$ day vacation for you and your family because actually our normal Social Evening has been expanded to $2\frac{1}{2}$ days with the business meeting held on the Sunday. I like it:

MEALS

Please DO NOT BRING FOOD OR SERVICE as in the past. You won't need it! Full meals will be served buffet-style, all you can eat. There'll be the evening meal on Fri., 3 on Sat. and 2 on Sunday (breakfast and lunch).

ROOMS

This may turn out to be one of the fun parts because these rooms are set-up different. Being a retreat, the rooms sleep either 4 or 6 folks--so you get to pick your own roommates, preferrably some who do not snore. The rooms are 1st class with A.C. Linen, blankets and pillows are furnished.

This is the best part. The cost is definitely "in line." It will be determined by when you arrive. If you're there $2\frac{1}{2}$ days, you'll have 6 full meals, 2 nights lodging (Fri. & Sat. nites) plus use of all facilities at a cost of \$58.50 per adult total and \$36.00 per child--HOWEVER--maximum charge per family will not exceed \$180.00 for all $2\frac{1}{2}$ days. Age 5 & under--no charge!

If you arrive Sat. ArTER lunch, the charge is \$39.00 per adult and \$26.00 per child total for both days. If you have the Sunday lunch only, the charge is only \$6.00 per adult and \$3.00 per child. Please DO NOT SEND ME ANY MONEY for room and board as this will be paid directly at the registration desk-BUT-DO FILL IN THE FORM at the end of this Newsletter and return it to me so that Camp Lone Star folks can get an idea of our head-count.

Let me be clear about Friday, the 15th. You can arrive at Camp Lone Star anytime you wish Fri. but only the night meal will be served. All other facilities are yours to enjoy. Camp Lone Star has to average \$40.00 per head per day to keep their doors open and I think you can see how they've adjusted their prices for us, by averaging.

Vans and campers will be allowed as long as there are not too many of them and ARE SELF-CONTAINED. There are no hook-ups available. Also, be warned, there are no level parking areas for them. The hosts do not encourage this much and I don't think the price reduction warrants dragging them there and back home again.

There are two additional charges we must pay. The horseback riding charge will be \$2.50 for those who want to ride and we will take up a small collection to offset the beer charge.

Please bring suitable clothing for your outside activities, folding chairs for your family for outside use, beach towels, sports gear your family enjoys, and plenty of sun tan lotion.
