

DIRECTIONS TO CAMP LONE STAR


Immediately south of La Grange on Highway #77 South (to Victoria), is a bridge spanning the Colorado river. About 150 yards from the southern end of this bridge is a sign saying "CAMP LONE STAR." Turn on that road (east) and go 2 miles to the camp, simply following the signs. One-half mile is paved, the other $1\frac{1}{2}$ is dirt but usually in very good condition. Park, register in the RETREAT CENTER, unload your car and get set for a relaxing time. Bring your charming personality with you, please:

MEALS

Please NO NOT BRING FOOD OR SERVICE. You won't need any! Full meals will be served buffet-style and I mean all you can eat. There will be three meals on Sat. and 2 on Sunday (breakfast and lunch) BUT NO MEAL ON FRIDAY.

ROOMS

Being a 1st class retreat, the rooms sleep either 4 or 6--so you can pick your own roommates, preferrably some who don't snore! The rooms are nice, air-conditioned, and linen, blankets and pillows are furnished.



COST

The cost is definitely reasonable and will be determined by your arrival time. If you're there $2\frac{1}{2}$ days, you'll have 5 full meals, 2 lodging nights (Fri. & Sat.) plus full use of all facilities at a cost of \$61.20 per adult and \$38.50 per child--HOWEVER--maximum charge per family will not exceed \$180.00 for all $2\frac{1}{2}$ days. Age 5 and under--no charge!

If you arrive Sat. or Sun., your charge will be prorated from the above figures.

PLEASE DO NOT SEND ME ANY MONEY for room and board as this will be paid directly at the registration desk--BUT DO FILL IN THE FORM at the end of this Newsletter and return it to me so that Camp Lone Star can get an idea of our head count.

VANS AND CAMPERS

Vans and campers are allowed as long as there are not too many of them and are SELF-CONTAINED. There are no hook-ups available. Also be warned, there are no level parking areas for them. The Hosts do not encourage this much and I don't think the price reduction warrants bringing them anyway.

THE STORY OF COMPUTERS

The 1984 Reunion passed a motion calling for the expenditure of \$1,000 for a Family owned computer and accessories. This sum, plus more, was donated on the spot by various members at that time. However, after much shopping and comparison, I was finally able to deduce that the Commodore 64 computer, which I had recommended, was not capable of handling the needs of this Family. It simply wasn't big enough. So, we made a change. We have now purchased an Apple 2e computer with dual disk drives, 128K memory, expandable to 512K and even 10 megabytes should the need ever arise. We also own a 13" amber Taxan moniter, an Epson LX-80 printer, it's interface board, an 80 column expander board and misc. paper and supplies.

It's a magnificent machine but it wasn't purchased in time for the Secretary to learn how to use it properly in order to meet the deadline of this particular Newsletter. The rig was purchased for the purpose of preparing our Newsletters, for normal secretarial correspondence, the recording onto disks of our historical documents, and for the preparation, storing, and compiling of our Family geneology. It's most immediate use will be the formation of Vol. III.

Thank You . . .


