TOURS

TOUR # 1 Monument Hill--is just up the hill from Camp Lone Star. This is the monument where the victim remains of the Meir expedition were brought. This can be toured in an hour or less since it is so close. There is an old brewery there which is being restored. It is really a beautiful place with a good view of the valley below. It is a good place to go on Sat. or Sun. mornings, plus the two concerts mentioned in the agenda.

TOUR #2 The grave of Peter Carl von Rosenberg, the one common ancestor of us all, is in La Grange across the highway from Bonton's.

TOUR #3 The grave of Amanda is between Round Top and Winedale Museum. Also the historical marker for Nassau Plantation which Peter Carl bought and where he and the family lived. It is near Winedale.

TOUR #4 Henkel Square is in Round Top. These are old homes which have been moved there and restored by Mrs. Bybee. One is a von Rosenberg home. We toured Henkel Square at a Reunion some years back and everyone was very impressed.

TOUR #5 Winedale Museum is also in Round Top. The tour takes about an hour, as does Henkel Square, and round-trip driving time is also an hour. Charge about \$2.00 each.

TOUR # 6 Fayette County Historical Society has an exhibit at the La Grange Library just across the river from Camp Lone Star. Open on Sat. morning only.

ABOUT THE TOURS

The tours can be combined almost any way you wish Classical music concert, Festival Hill- with one exception. Tours #4 and #5 cannot be combined due to the time element required (Henkel Square and Winedale Museum.) Simply choose one of these and combine it with any other except the opposite one shown above. PLEASE NOTE: We will need an advance headcount for the tours, so please be sure to indicate such on the registration form shown at the end of this Newsletter. If you don't preregister for the tours, Dale (as in WineDale), will not love thee anymore!

DIRECTIONS TO CAMP LONE STAR

Immediately south of La Grange, on Hwy. #77 So. to Victoria, is a bridge spanning the Colo. river. About 150 yards from the southern end of this bridge is a sign saying "CAMP LONE STAR." Turn east on that road and go 2 miles to the Camp, simply following the signs. $\frac{1}{2}$ mile is paved, the other $1\frac{1}{2}$ is dirt but usually in good condition. Bring your charming personality with you, please.

ROOMS

Being a 1st class retreat, the rooms sleep either 4 or 6 so you can pick your own roommates, preferrably some who are not grouchy early in the morning. The rooms are air-conditioned and very nice. Linen, blankets and pillows are furnished.

COST

The cost is definitely reasonable and favorably compares with or beats any other manner of financing your Reunion expenses. The cost is determined by your arrival time. If you spend the full $2\frac{1}{2}$ days there, you'll have 5 full meals, 2 nights lodging, plus full use of all facilities for \$61.20 per adult and \$38.50 per child-HOWEVER-maximum charge per FAMILY will not exceed \$180.00 for all 21 days. Age 5 and under--no charge. If you arrive Sat. or Sun., your charge will be prorated from the above figures. Van and campers are not recommended. THE 1986 REUNION

The 1986 Reunion was held at Camp Lone Star in La Grange, Tx., July 18, 19, & 20. The business meeting was officially opened on 7-19 at 4:00 p.m. by Pres. Wm. F. von Rosenberg III of Austin with an attendance of 48 at this meeting, 79 registered for entire Reunion. We pledged allegiance to our flag, the minutes were approved as contained in the June, 1986, Newsletter and Treasurer Robert Hein of San Antonio gave the Treasurer's report.

Under old business, after considerable discussion, it was moved that we print 500 copies of Vol. I in it's present format at a price of \$3,500 with each copy retailing at \$15.00 plus \$1.00 handling and mailing charge. This motion passed.

Another discussion followed about Vol. III which is slowly taking shape. Dale U. von Rosenberg, Family Historian, indicated 419 biographies or more would be needed for this Vol., more than double the number in Vol. II and would be a for-

midable undertaking due to size and content. The Secretary was instructed to continue learning the new soft-ware geneology program recently purchase and make a progress report at the '87 Reunion.

The members present voted to hold the '87 Reunion at Camp Lone Star on July 17, 18, & 19.

After comments of a general nature from the floor the meeting was adjourned at 4:45 p.m.

MINUTES -- SUNDAY, JULY 20, 1986

The meeting opened at 10:00 a.m. at Camp Lone Star under the direction of Pres. Wm. F. von Rosenberg III of Austin. After everyone introduced themselves, Forrest M. Campbell of Somerset, N.J. was found to be the eldest in attendance, age 72; the youngest was Amie von Rosenberg of Rockdale, Tx., $2\frac{1}{2}$ months, daughter of Sheryl and David von Rosenberg and Ruth and Jack Arnold Campbell of Rockaway, N.J. traveled the greatest distance to attend, 1900 miles. Whew!

Glenn von Rosenberg presented a memorial service in honor of those members who passed away since the last Reunion:

Eugene Elzy (Buddie) Adams died 1-26-86, buried in Naurna Cemetery near Lampasas, Tx., 1-28-86. He reached the age of 89 and died in Temple, Tx. See Vol. II, p. 234.

Arthur Meerscheidt Scholz died 5-5-86, buried at South Park Mission in San Antonio. See Vol. II, p. 260.

Dr. Ernest Walter Wupperman died 2-17-86, at Cedar Park, Tx. Vol. II, p. 23.

Miles Littleton Moss died 6-6-86, in La Grange, Tx. Vol. II, p. 142.

After general comments from the floor, most expressing their satisfaction about Camp Lone Star as our meeting place, the meeting was adjourned at 10:50 a.m.
