



THE 1987 REUNION REVISITED

The 1987 Reunion was held at Camp Lone Star in La Grange, Tx., July 17-18-19. The business meeting was officially opened on 7-18 at 4:00 p.m. by Pres. Wm. F. von Rosenberg, III of Austin with an attendance of 70 members. We pledged allegiance to our flag, the minutes were approved as contained in the June, 1987 Newsletter and Treasurer Robert Hein gave his report.

Under old business, Historian Dale U. von Rosenberg explained the whole process of getting Vol. I printed and available at this Reunion. He especially thanked all members who made loans to the Association for Vol. I and to those who sent in their orders and money used to pay the printer before he would commence. Dale received a standing ovation for his very fine and needed efforts. On the subject of Vol. III, he announced that he will be appointing Branch Chairmen for the Assoc. in due time as well as his plans and schedule to collect data from all members.

Under new business, the following slate of officers were elected to serve through the year 1989:

Ruth Campbell of Rockaway, NJ, Ann Juranek of Humble and Darlyn Bechtol are to take 1/3 of the Sec.'s roladex file of addresses and put them on their computers.

A motion was made and passed that the 1988 Reunion be held the 3rd week-end of July at Camp Lone Star, possibly for the last time and that a "Search Committee" be appointed to find a new site for the '89. The Presappointed the following to that committee: Roger von Rosenberg, chm., Darlyn Bechtol, Karl von Rosenberg of Austin and himself.

It was moved that our Association donate 4 copies of Vol. II to Mrs. Charles L. Bybee of Round Top, Tx. Mrs. Bybee owns Henckel Square (rebuilt historic houses) in that city.

Marjorie von Rosenberg of Dallas made a few short comments about her books and literature she has had published afterwhich the meeting was adjourned at 5:28 p.m.


Look at this!
