Dale and Marjorie von Rosenberg paid a visit to Galveston to retrace the route pioneer family took from there to Nassau.




# 150th Anniversary Reunion takes a look at the past


he 1999 annual family reunion of the Rosenbergs of Texas celebrated the 150th anniversary of Peter Carl

# Volume III nearing the final stages

The long-awaited update of family history commonly known Volume III, is in its final stages of completion.

Recently, Historian Ann Barnes met in Waco with Jo von Rosenberg, Nettie Green, and Ray von Rosenberg at Jo's home where about 50 to 60 hours of work was done in a four day period. The database is currently just under 2500 names. Of those, it was determined that over 400 people are in Generation 5. Of those in Generation 5, fewer than biographical sketches have been received. Biographical sketches in Volume II or the Red Book, were for fourth generation descendants of Peter Carl. Included with this newsletter is a complete list by branch of the sketches still needed. This newsletter will be the last plea for biographies. Let's not leave anyone out.

Jim Kearny, a local resident and historian in turn presented a lengthy and informative report about the Nassau Plantation. Jim is currently working on a book about Nassau which he hopes to publish soon. He has obtained copies of original deeds and other court documents that tell the story of Nassau and how the family came to obtain and lose the land.

## More of Saturday Activities

Lithuania became independent from Communist Russia in 1989. Neighboring countries of Poland, Czech Republic and Hungry became members of NATO in 1999, but Lithuania is struggling to meet the GNP and financial criteria for membership.

Magda, our Polish guide, was very efficient in finding the Voversaite Baltic Sea Resort in Palanga, 10 miles from Klaipeda (Memel) which was on the Baltic Sea. It was very beautiful, but very cold and would be our residence for two nights.

Edward, our Russian and Lithuania guide took us to the research facilities in Klaipeda. After three research libraries we found the Geschechte des Kreises Memel (History of the Memel Area), a book written in 1918. As we explained our primary purpose, to find the Ekitten Estates, Peter and Edward insisted on maps along with pages of information copied from the book. The researchers were very cooperative and even with the language problem and our eagerness, they copied what we needed to find the land.

They would not allow us to pay them directly, but we made a contribution to the research facility.

The search began, and four hours later we felt confident we had, indeed, found the Eckitten Land. Words cannot describe the joy of walking across the spillway onto the land that today appears to be used for recreational purposes. As we walked the terrain, we found picnic areas and fishing piers. Beautiful trees in the center of the highest part, and where we presumed the home stood, was a breathtaking view. One could see the river. lake and surrounding flat farmland. Finding the marker with a definite place for the von Rosenberg Coat of Arms was without a doubt the high point of the day!

As we reflect on this marvelous experience, we would also like to share with you that the uncanny resemblance to the Nassau Plantation was overwhelming. The comparison is exciting for many reasons, but most of all because people seeking new places often seek areas that remind them of home. Eckitten and Nassau are extremely similar, except for the weather.

Glenn and Jo brought a photo album of their trip to share with everyone at the reunion. They also had some of the panoramic photos framed which were part of the silent auction.
