Cost

he cost at Camp Lone Star is reasonable and compares favorably with any other manner of financing your reunion expenses.

The cost is pro-rated and is determined by your arrival time.

Please get your reservation in as soon as possible for rooms at Camp Lone Star. If you cannot come all weekend, come early Saturday to take part in our day trips and the afternoon's activities.

The best price is a package price: Spend the full 2 1/2 days and you'll get 5 full meals, 2 nights lodging, plus full use of all facilities for approximately \$96.75 per adult (18 years and older); about \$63.00 per youth (ages 8 to 17); children age 7 and under are free.

If you come part of the time: \$30 per night (\$20 for youths 8-17) and \$15 per meal (\$10 youths 8-17) which includes a mandatory facility use charge. Facility use charge includes a meal plus the use of the facility as well as use of any accommodations such as swimming, volleyball, basketball, hot tub, etc.

RVs and campers are not recommended since there is no place set aside to park them.
