1939 Reunion Honors Its Youngest

Harold Wayne von Rosenberg (Branch IV) of Austin & La-Grange recently informed our President that he was the youngest attendee at the 1939 von Rosenberg Family Reunion held in Round Top, Texas. For his status as the youngest, Harold received a certificate to that effect, which he still has in his possession. The 1939 reunion was the first ever held by the family and started the tradition of meeting annually in various locales around Texas. Approximately 150 descendents of Peter Carl Johann von Rosenberg gathered in Round Top that day on Sunday, May, 7, 1939. Family members came from all parts of Texas including Brownsville, San Angelo, Austin, Houston, Bellville, LaGrange as well as many other cities, towns and rural locations.

On display @ that reunion were relics having historical bearing on the original forebear, Peter Carl von Rosenberg. The reading of old letters and newspaper clippings, replete with extraordinary material were among the high points on that Sunday.

REUNION HIGHLIGHTS

SATURDAY MORNING TOUR OF THE TEXAS CZECH HERITAGE CENTER

Tour of the Texas Czech Heritage Center (TCHC) of LaGrange: the family has made special arrangements for a Saturday morning private tour of the new Czech Museum beginning at 10am and lasting approximately an hour. In a state wide competition held several years ago, LaGrange, TX was named the official Czech Center for the State of Texas. The German and Czech communities have functioned side-by-side for 140 years in Fayette County, and many of the German and Czech families through marriage can now boast common alliances.

The TCHC received State and international attention last year with the opening of its new multi-million dollar state of the art museum built at the Fayette County Fairgrounds that was once von Rosenberg ranch land. The opening occurred during the summer of 2009 and was officiated by not only state and regional dignitaries but also the United States Ambassador for the Czech Republic from Washington, DC. Other Czech facilities at the Fairgrounds include an outdoor amphitheatre and a cluster of historic Fayette County homes and miscellaneous structures that have been moved to the TCHC for preservation.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER & REKNOWN AUTHOR, JAMES C. KEARNEY SUBJECT: HIS NEWLY RELEASED BOOK "NASSAU PLANTATION" & THE VON ROSENBERG YEARS

James (Jim) C. Kearney will be our keynote speaker this year and will give a PowerPoint presentation for about 30 minutes on Nassau Plantation. Jim graduated from the University of Texas in 1969 with a double major in German and history. He studied German language and literature at the University in working toward his doctorate. Discouraged by the job market, he retooled in the Graduate School of Business. Currently he teaches German at Katy High School near Houston and has been a featured speaker at numerous conventions and symposiums on Texas, German subjects and is at present a student again at the University of Texas working on the completion of his PhD. Kearney lives with his wife of 35 years on the historic family ranch in Colorado County, Texas—where he grew up.

Jim will focus on the fascinating history of the Nassau Plantation including the involvement of the von Rosenberg family with the Manor House and 800 acres out of the original tract.

Many of you may recall his lecture on Nassau Plantation at one of our reunions a number of years ago. Expect this year's topic to take the subject to a new depth never before heard but now documented in his newly released book titled "Nassau Plantation, The Evolution of a Texas German Slave Plantation". Jim has devoted an entire chapter to the involvement of the von Rosenberg family. The lecture will immediately follow our business meeting and Jim has agreed to stay afterwards if anyone is interested in hearing more. **Don't miss this lecture !!!!!!**

Special Note: On June 12, 2010, there will be a book signing for Jim and his new book titled "Nassau Plantation, The Evolution of a Texas German Slave Plantation". Mary Belle Rather, who is the present owner of the property once occupied by the vonRosenberg family @ Nassau Plantation is organizing the event. The event will be held @ the Round Top Town Square and will begin @ approximately 10 am.

he cost at Camp Lone Star is both reasonable and comparable to other venues in the area. Nightly room stays (meals included) are offered in either one or two night packages with adult and youth rates applying. For a two night stay, which includes five meals, an adult package is \$117.00 (18 years and above). The youth package (17 years and younger) is less at \$91.00. Children (5 years and under), who are accompanied by their parents, stay for free. One night stays would be calculated on a pro-rated basis with at least two meals included. For those, who come for the day, and plan to attend the daytime activities such as Saturday events including but not limited to the Czech Center morning tour, lunch at Camp Lone Star, the Saturday business meeting at Camp Lone Star, the afternoon lecture by James C. Kearney, which follows the business meeting, the evening meal at Camp Lone Star, the Meerscheidt House Reception & Dessert Party in La Grange and music, dance, movies & refreshments to follow late into the evening at Camp Lone Star, will be charged only for the price of the meals they consume. However, donations towards Camp Lone Star overhead will be accepted. Prices for adult meals (10 years & older) is \$10.00/meal. Children between the ages of 6 & 9 years pay \$8.00/meal. Children 5 years and under eat for free.

Please get your reservation in as soon as possible for nightly stays. If you do not plan to spend any nights, then come early Saturday to take part in our day trips as well as the afternoon and evening activities. Daytime users are encouraged to use the registration forms to indicate the number of adult and children meals that they plan to consume. This will be helpful so that Camp kitchen staff can plan enough food for all reunion attendees whether they spend the night or not. (Handwrite your estimation of meals at the bottom of the form and send to Debbie Smith, Secretary, as directed).

RVs and campers are not recommended since there is no place set aside to park them.

<u>Dírectíons to Camp Lone Star</u>

If Coming from La Grange: Take State Hwy 77 south out of La Grange towards Schulenburg. Immediately after crossing over the Colorado River bridge that exits La Grange, turn left (east) onto Camp Lone Star Road.

If coming from Schulenburg/I-10: Take State Hwy 77 north from Schulenburg to La Grange (about 17 miles). As you reduce your speed while descending into La Grange from the "Bluff", you will encounter a number of highway "S curves" on that approach. As you reach the bottom of the "Bluff" and before you cross the Colorado River bridge into La Grange, make a hard right (east) onto Camp Lone Star Road.

Camp Lone Star Road meanders for about two miles as a tree shaded lane to the entrance at Camp Lone Star. Once inside the camp grounds, stay to the right on the main road and proceed past the Camp Office but do not stop. A short ways past the office will be a parking area to your left camouflaged by a forest of trees. Turn here into the parking lot via one of two entrances. Once parked, take the concrete sidewalk that follows the hillside down to the Johnson Center. The entrance door from the parking lot is an unceremonious approach into the Center. The first room to be encountered inside is likewise uneventful and houses Ping-pong tables. Proceed straight ahead through a doorway into a hallway that leads straight back to the Assembly Room where you will find Registration and Reception.
